These investments focus on alternatives to guardianship and the use of a full range of decisional supports so that older adults and adults with I/DD are making decisions as independently as possible. Between 2014 and 2019, AoA and AoD jointly funded the National Resource Center for Supported Decision Making (SDM).

Traditionally, less restrictive alternatives take the form of surrogate decision-making, with a designated decision-maker making the final decision. Recently, supported decision-making (SDM) has emerged as a cutting edge alternative to guardianship, placing the individual with a disability at the center of the decision-making process.

Assessment of Decision-Making Capacity in Older Adults: An ...

Guardianship orders to appoint a guardian to make personal or lifestyle decisions for someone with decision making disabilities. Financial management orders to appoint a financial manager for someone who is not capable of managing their affairs. Consent for treatment by a doctor or dentist.

Guardianship is not the only option. Supported Decision-Making is an alternative model, where people with disabilities keep their rights and their decision-making capacity. Instead of having a guardian make choices for them, people with disabilities have supporters who help them make their own choices.

The effects of multiple interacting medical conditions on decision-making abilities vary across individuals, affecting some aspects of decision making and not others, calling for sophisticated and functionally oriented capacity assessment. Attention to capacity issues is also increasing as a result of large-scale financial and cultural changes.

The assessment instrument is not a test but is a required Department for Children and Families (DCF) form. It is an informal tool which shall be used when gathering information about a person's capacity of self-care.

STANDARD POWER OF ATTORNEY FOR KRS 27A.095 MEDICAL/SCHOOL ...

Recommendations should be made regarding services or interventions needed by this person, such as homemaker services or care from a nurse or caseworker. If indicated, recommendations should include assisted decision-making options such as surrogate decision-making or various forms of guardianship.
